## Why do I need to do this training?

The Recreational Vehicle Manufacturers' Association of Australia (RVMAA) believes that all people who regularly service or repair Recreational Vehicles should hold this Certificate:



**What do I need to do to get this Certificate?** To achieve the Certificate, you need to successfully complete:

- 15 core units of competency
- 7 x elective units of competency selected from the 10 listed below.

### What costs are involved?

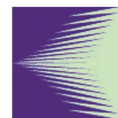
If the selected employee is a new employee with no prior qualifications then they would be signed up and receive full federal funding with only a \$545 fee payable. If the employee is an existing employee (without any prior qualifications or with qualifications over 7 years old) then the enrolment cost is \$1500 (refunded by the government to the employer about three weeks after the completion certificate is received).

### Core Units

- Develop and update caravan industry knowledge
- Plan and organise daily work with colleagues and customers
- Follow health, safety and security procedures
- Use hand and power tools
- Carry out measurements and calculations
- Read and interpret plans and drawings for a recreational vehicle
- Carry out mechanised cutting
- Apply technical knowledge of recreational vehicle manufacturing to work activities
- Apply quality standards and procedures
- Coach other in job skills
- Meet occupational health and safety requirements associated with electrical work
- Attach flexible cords and plugs to electrical equipment to 250 volt supply
- Assess and quote the job
- Perform routine manual arc welding OR Perform routine gas metal arc welding

### The Elective Units

- Repair/ service a recreational vehicle chassis
- Repair wall and roof of a recreational vehicle
- Repair/replace 12/24 volt DC electrical cabling within a recreational vehicle
- Repair/service LP gas systems in a recreational vehicle
- Remove and re-install furniture and appliances in a recreational vehicle
- Service/repair water system in a recreational vehicle
- Replace damaged sheeting and glazing of a recreational vehicle
- Repair or service running gear for a recreational vehicle
- Perform routine manual arc welding
- Perform routine gas metal arc welding
